The social, political and ecological movements of the recent years have reaffirmed the potential of young people as the key drivers of societal change.

This creates a need to provide young leaders with a better understanding of the complex social systems of India and challenges faced by the marginalized. In this age of information and new media, it is further important to gain a nuanced understanding of how India is being shaped politically, socially and economically. The IUIF fellowship enables young fellows to gain insights and recognize how multiple forms of inequalities like caste, class, race and gender overlap and operate together to exacerbate marginalization. The fellowship also enables fellows to recognize how media shapes and is shaped by this social and political architecture.

The C4SC and Media Rights Fellowship program is designed to take young Indians through an intense leadership journey that sets them on a path to understand communication and media from the perspective of human rights and intersectional feminism. They will learn to leverage the power of communication to discover new pathways for information creation, access & sharing; while questioning hegemonic technologies and power relations. The Fellows are mentored to become socially conscious leaders and are equipped with skills that help them amplify the voices and stories of the marginalized thereby catalyzing positive social transformation.

FELLOWSHIP VISION

We envision a future where leaders are driven by a commitment to equity and social justice with an understanding of intersectionality and privilege and are skilled in using communication and media to achieve these goals. We are committed to a future of equitable access to and creation of information, knowledge and technologies; A future where IUIF Fellows become thought-leaders and use creative and participatory communication methods to foster diversity of voices and opinions, ensuring greater citizen access to and rights over media.



FELLOWSHIP MISSION

Our mission is to engage young Indians in exploring ways to reduce power and knowledge inequities through action informed by the principles of participatory and community media, intersectionality and human rights. We also aim to expose them to the complex social systems that foster inequity in every sphere of human existence. We hope to help them find points of intersection where communication and media can contribute to open knowledge systems, achieving sustainable development goals and addressing complex issues.

OUR OBJECTIVE

To create and sustain a learning platform and network of young Indians and guide them through an intensive journey of discovering their leadership potential to evolve as next-generation leaders who are committed to knowledge equity, freedom of expression, media freedoms, communication rights and intersectionality.

WHAT ARE WE LOOKING FOR IN A CANDIDATE?

We are looking for potential Communication leaders. We believe that these leaders should exhibit certain values which are at the heart of a leadership journey. The fellows are expected to live by these values.

- Authenticity: Be true to oneself and others without fear and have congruence between thought and action.
- Openness to Learning: Committed to learn and also help others learn.
- **Humility:** Patience, and a humble approach to work combined with good humor.
- Flexibility and Adaptability: Ability to be flexible and adaptable when facing difficult situations.
- Respect for Diversity: A keen interest to listen, learn, reflect and contribute to the journeys of peers belonging to diverse backgrounds.
- Commitment to Social Change: Committed to explore ways in which one's own personal role can bring social transformation.
- **Perseverance:** Persistence in doing something that you believe in, despite difficulty or delay in achieving success.
- Strong belief in Freedom of Speech: Belief that Freedom of Speech and free media are important pillars of democracy.
- Commitment towards strengthening democratic values.
- Willingness to unpack hierarchies and power structures in the larger political and economic frameworks that fuel and sustain marginalization.
- A desire to acquire the requisite media skills and build on scholarship through immersive engagement with communities and practitioners.
- A willingness to **explore complexities and unpack truths** in order to find unique & useful ways of using communication to contribute to knowledge equity and people's rights to media technologies

- 4 MONTH FULL-TIME COMMITMENT TO THE FELLOWSHIP.

THE FELLOWSHIP JOURNEY




SKILLS

Fellows will be trained in art and the craft of writing, digital storytelling; audio and video production; social media practice; participatory research; fact-checking and reporting; understanding and using data; and communication ethics.

PERSPECTIVE BUILDING

Immersive sessions with mentors who are leaders in their fields on understanding diverse and relevant topics including the media environment; communication rights; the internet and related issues; media law; gender, feminism and intersectionality; climate change and climate justice; international development and civil society; and education and health.





REFLECTION SPACES

Fellows are provided extensive readings and encouraged to reflect on them. The Fellowship follows an act-pause-reflect-act design that pushes fellows to complete assignments reflecting on their learning, digesting their experiences, and writing about them.

DURATION AND STIPEND

Four month full-time engagement with a commitment to produce audio/video/written Fellowship deliverables. Fellows will propose projects, of which a few will be selected for execution and support with a stipend of Rs.50000.




Owing to the extraordinary situation prevailing in the wake of COVID-19, the current cohorts of IUIF have been redesigned as an online learning experience.
